RESOLUTION NO: 2025-06

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY INVERNESS, FLORIDA APPROVING THE CONTINUED EXISTENCE OF THE **INVERNESS** COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT **AGENCY** AND **EXTENDING** TERMINATION DATE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 163.3755(1), FLORIDA STATUTES; **AMENDING** THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN TO EXTEND THE TIME CERTAIN FOR COMPLETING ALL REDEVELOPMENT FINANCED BY INCREMENT REVENUES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 163.361, FLORIDA STATUTES; **PROVIDING** FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Part III, Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, the Community Redevelopment Act of 1969, as amended (the "Redevelopment Act"), on October 16, 1990, the City of Inverness ("City") adopted Ordinance No. 434, creating the Inverness Community Redevelopment Agency ("ICRA") to undertake redevelopment within established areas located within the corporate limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Part III, Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, On October 16, 1990, the City adopted Resolution 90-06, determining that the area within the City identified as the Central Business District ("Original Development Area"), was appropriate for redevelopment and made findings of necessity for such area; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 163.355, Florida Statutes, on March 17, 2015, the City adopted Resolution No. 2015-05, which found that additional areas within the City were also blighted and in need of redevelopment and expanded the Original Development Area (the expanded redevelopment area is referred to as the "Redevelopment Area"); and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Area is governed by a redevelopment plan adopted and amended pursuant to the terms of Sections 163.360 and 163.361, Florida Statutes (the "Redevelopment Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Plan provided for a time certain of 2044 for completing all redevelopment financed by increment revenues; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Section 163.361, if at any time after the approval of a community redevelopment plan it becomes necessary or desirable to amend or modify such plan, the City Council may amend such plan upon the recommendation of ICRA.

WHEREAS, on August 7, 2025, at a regularly scheduled meeting, ICRA recommended that the time certain for completing all redevelopment financed by increment revenues be extended to thirty (30) years from the date this Resolution is adopted.

WHEREAS, in 2019, the Florida Legislature enacted Section 163.3755(1), Florida Statutes, which mandated the following:

A community redevelopment agency in existence on October 1, 2019, shall terminate on the expiration date provided in the agency's charter on October 1, 2019, or on September 30, 2039, whichever is earlier, unless the governing body of the county or municipality that created the community redevelopment agency approves its continued existence by a majority vote of the members of the governing body.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3755(1), Florida Statutes, ICRA is currently set to terminate on September 30, 2039;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 163.3755(1), Florida Statutes, the City Council, may approve by a majority vote to extend the termination date of ICRA; and

WHEREAS, the City Council deems approval of this Resolution to be in the best interests of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City and the public at large so that redevelopment, as defined by Section 163.340(9) of the Redevelopment Act, can continue in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF INVERNESS, FLORIDA, that:

SECTION 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are hereby incorporated as

the findings of the City Council.

SECTION 2. The City Council approves the continued existence of the CRA and extends its termination date in accordance with Section 163.3755(1), Florida Statutes, from September 30, 2039, to August 19, 2055.

SECTION 3. The City Council approves amendment of the Redevelopment Plan to extend the time certain for completing all redevelopment financed by increment revenues to August 19, 2055.

SECTION 4. Any projects currently in the Redevelopment Plan, or which may be subsequently added, are hereby approved for funding.

SECTION 5. Each provision of this Resolution shall be deemed separate and severable and if any section or part is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Resolution shall not be affected.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage and adoption.

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
